Time With Tim

That's one of the things I love most about our First Family; we are family and show our Christianity as such. Even though we have people in our church of all kinds of beliefs about political stuff, and social justice stuff, and even how we understand, relate to, and translate scripture, we are still family and work together for the betterment of each other and the Great Bend mission field.

Some of you know that there are some United Methodist Churches that have chosen to disaffiliate from the denomination. That means they are leaving the UMC. While I won't go into great detail here (but I'll gladly talk to you about the topic if you like) I will say that those churches, in my opinion, are not near as cool as ours. Not because they are leaving, but because they don't have the diversity that we do. They all see things exactly the same way. I honestly believe that having diversity in our church makes us VERY Christian.

Just look at the disciples! They jockeyed for power and position. They argued about whether to let kids near, whether the woman should anoint Jesus, pretty much every topic that came up. Except, of course, for the fact that Jesus was the Christ, the Son of the Living God. That was enough for them. And they learned and grew from each other's background and differences.

And really for four fisherman, a tax collector, a zealot, a thief, and I forget the rest, they did pretty good getting along. Because they had a glue that held them together. The main thing. Jesus Christ and his message of Love God, love neighbor, and love your enemy. Once Jesus gave himself up and was resurrected they seemed to get it more but still, there was arguing among them.

And according to Paul and his letters and teachings, it seems that the churches had the same kind of issues as us. So what did he say, among other things? Things like, keep meeting together in Ephesians, and don't cause others to stumble or turn away in Romans.

Look at all the ministries being done in this church in October (they are all in this newsletter) and you make the decision. Are we currently relevant and vital to the Great Bend mission field as First United Methodist Church? I'd have to say, "Yep, and will be for another 150 years."

It genuinely surprises me how soon they break out the candy and decorations for the spooky season.

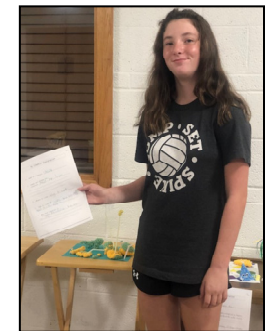
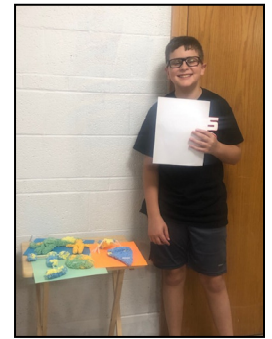
Pumpkins, apple cider, and spiders, as far as the eye can see, what a joyous time of the year.

1960 *Clarion* Shows a Different Side of First UMC

PIECE OF OUR HISTORY

The *Clarion* looked a lot different in 1960, came out weekly and included Sunday's Order of Worship and statistics.

Shirley Henning brought in this December 11, 1960, edition of the *Clarion*. It is a tri-fold, 8x16-inch newsletter printed with 7- or 8-point type (note: the current *Clarion* is done in 12-point type).

Some of the statistics listed on the back for the previous Sunday, included:

Church School Attendance was 717; Worship Attendance was 630;



Methodist Youth Fellowship Attendance was 53, Bible Study Class Attendance was 29.

One article featured the U-R Welcome Class:

"The U-R Welcome Class Party will be Monday, December 19, at 6:30 p.m. Members are asked to bring 1 meat dish and 1 other large dish and their own table service. Santa Claus will present gifts to the children."

The United Women of Faith, with LaVonne Gerritzen moderating, will begin a new bible study October 25th. Anyone may join the bible study group.

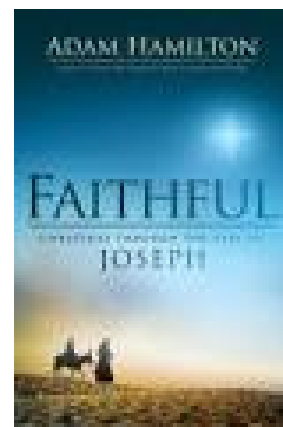
They will be using Adam Hamilton's "Faithful-Christmas Through the Eyes of Joseph" to study

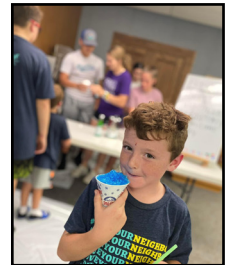
