## THANKSGIVING SUNDAY SERVICE/DINNER

Since the beginning of Judeao/Christian history, people have been eating together as a sign of God's reign or kingdom. For instance in the old testament:

'On this mountain, the Lord of heavenly forces will prepare for all peoples a rich feast, a feast of choice wines, of select foods rich in flavor, of choice wines well refined.' Isaiah 25:6

'You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows.' Psalm 23:5

Jesus's ministry was all about this tradition. Just as he shared food with all sorts and conditions of people as a sign of the inclusivity of God's kingdom, so too did the early church. The gatherings to eat together were earthly representations of the heavenly banquet imagery that had been reinforced by Jesus through his teaching as well as his actions. Following in the


